Many thanks to our speaker, **Norah McMeeking**, who was able to fill-in for the scheduled speaker, who had to postpone her visit with us until 2019.

Norah brought both a slide show and a trunk show to share with us. Her book, *Bella Bella Quilts* and its two following titles were well represented in the items she displayed.

Norah's website is **bellabellaquilts.com**. She wrote: It was my destiny! I'm descended from printers, sign painters and seamstresses (in alternating generations!). As soon as I met a sewing machine in Mrs. Regan's Home Ec. class, I was "hooked" and started making my own clothes and doing the family mending. I studied Graphics at the Rhode Island School of Design and went to work in publishing and advertising.

When I moved to central Illinois I saw my first quilts on a visit to the Chicago Art Institute and knew I had to learn how to make them. My first teacher taught me to do everything by hand, but I soon had two small children and my quilting output amounted to a small stack of blocks. Later on, in California, I discovered that some people made quilts with my old favorite, the sewing machine. I was shown a rotary cutter. I never looked back.

Now, when I'm up late quilting, alone at my machine, I think about my grandparents and how inevitable it was that I become a quilter. The perfect marriage of graphics and sewing – I am a happy woman.

# Scrappy Churn Dash

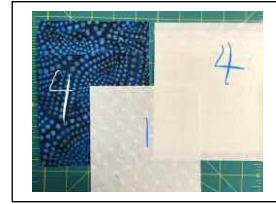
January Block Party

Approximately 13"

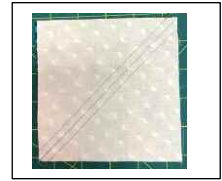
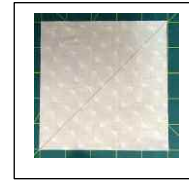
Fabric required:

5 – White on White 5" squares

4 – color of your choice 5" squares (only one color)



Draw a diagonal line on the backs of 2 of the WoW squares  
Place the WoW, right sides together, with the colored squared  
Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the line on both sides of the line 2x's

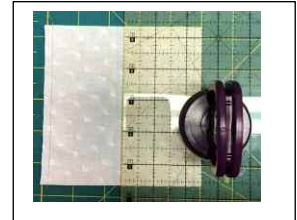


Cut on the drawn line and press to the dark. Square to  $4\frac{1}{2}$ "  
You will have 4 half square triangles

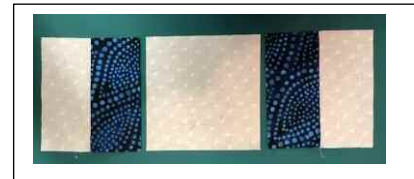
Place 2 of the remaining WoW squares on the 2 remaining  
color squares

Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " on two opposite sides as shown

Cut down the middle as shown Press



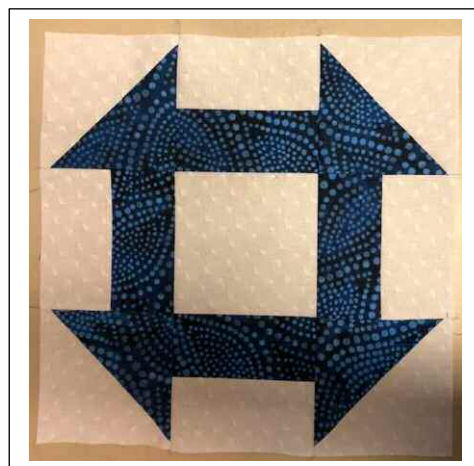
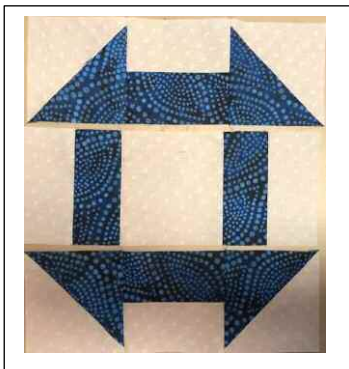
Place the remaining WoW square in between to of the  
Color/WoW pieces and sew as shown. 2 x's Press



Place two Half Square Triangles, as shown, and sew together.  
Repeat and Press



Place the rows, as shown below, and sew together. Press. **DO NOT TRIM**
